## **First Reading**

1 Corinthians 12:1-11 (EHV)

Now concerning spiritual gifts, brothers, I do not want you to be uninformed. <sup>2</sup> You know that when you were pagans, you were deceived and somehow led away to mute idols. <sup>3</sup> Therefore I am informing you that no one speaking by God's Spirit says, "A curse be upon Jesus," and no one can say, "Jesus is Lord," except by the Holy Spirit.

<sup>4</sup> There are various kinds of gifts, but the same Spirit. <sup>5</sup> There are different kinds of ministries, and yet the same Lord. <sup>6</sup> There are various kinds of activity, but the same God, who produces all of them in everyone.

<sup>7</sup> Each person is given a manifestation of the Spirit for the common good. <sup>8</sup> To one person a message of wisdom is given by the Spirit; to another, a message of knowledge, as the same Spirit provides it; <sup>9</sup> by the same Spirit, faith is given to someone else; and to another, the same Spirit gives healing gifts. <sup>10</sup> Another is given powers to do miracles; another, the gift of prophecy; another, the evaluating of spirits; someone else, different kinds of tongues; and another, the interpretation of tongues. <sup>11</sup> One and the same Spirit produces all of these, distributing them to each one individually as he desires.

- **P** The second reading is from Acts 2:1-21.
- Sanctify us by Your truth, O LORD. Your Word is truth!

When the day of Pentecost came, they were all together in one place. <sup>2</sup> Suddenly a sound like the rushing of a violent wind came from heaven, and it filled the whole house where they were sitting. <sup>3</sup> They saw divided tongues that were like fire resting on each one of them. <sup>4</sup> They were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, since the Spirit was giving them the ability to speak fluently.

<sup>5</sup> Now there were godly Jewish men from every nation under heaven living in Jerusalem. <sup>6</sup> When this sound was heard, a crowd came together and was confused, because each one heard them speaking in his own language. <sup>7</sup> They were completely baffled and said to each other, "Look, are not all these men who are speaking Galileans? <sup>8</sup> Then how is it that each of us hears them speaking in his own native language? <sup>9</sup> Parthians, Medes, and Elamites; residents of Mesopotamia, and of Judea, Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, <sup>10</sup> Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt, and the parts of Libya around Cyrene; visitors from Rome, both Jews and proselytes; <sup>11</sup> Cretans and Arabs—we hear them declaring in our own languages the wonderful works of God." <sup>12</sup> They were all amazed and perplexed. They kept saying to one another, "What does this mean?" <sup>13</sup> But others mocked them and said, "They are full of new wine."

<sup>14</sup> Then Peter stood up with the Eleven, raised his voice, and spoke loudly and clearly to them: "Men of Judea, and all you residents of Jerusalem, understand this, and listen closely to my words. <sup>15</sup> These men are not drunk, as you suppose, for it is only the third hour of the day. <sup>16</sup> On the contrary, this is what was spoken by the prophet Joel:

<sup>17</sup> This is what God says will happen in the last days:

I will pour out my Spirit on all flesh. Your sons and your daughters will prophesy. Your young men will see visions. Your old men will dream dreams.

<sup>18</sup> Even on my servants, both men and women,

I will pour out my Spirit in those days, and they will prophesy.

19 I will show wonders in the sky above, and signs on the earth below,
blood and fire and a rising cloud of smoke.

<sup>20</sup> The sun will be turned to darkness and the moon to blood before the coming of the great and glorious day of the Lord.

<sup>21</sup> And this will happen: Everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved.

P Blessed are they who hear the Word of God and keep it!

Luther's Small Catechism (Sydow - p. 135)

I believe in the Holy Spirit; the Holy Christian Church, the communion of saints; the forgiveness of sins; the resurrection of the body; and the life everlasting. Amen.

I believe that I cannot by my own reason or strength believe in Jesus Christ, my Lord, or come to Him.

But the Holy Spirit has called me by the Gospel, enlightened me with His gifts, sanctified and kept me in true faith.

In the same way He calls, gathers, enlightens, and sanctifies the whole Christian Church on earth and keeps it with Jesus Christ in the one true faith.

In This Christian Church He daily and richly forgives all sins to me and all believers.

On the Last Day He will raise me and all the dead and give to me and all believers in Christ eternal life.


# **Sermon Theme: Your Helper By Your Side**

- This word for "Helper" that Jesus uses in our text to describe the Holy Spirit is a very special word in the Greek: παράκλητος (Paraklatos. Pronounced: par-a-klay-tos), from which we get the word Paraclete (not "parakeet," Paraclete!). This word literally means "one called alongside to help."
- The Holy Spirit is our "Helper" by teaching us. (v. 26)
  - o What important things does the Holy Spirit teach us?
- ↑ The Holy Spirit is our "Helper" by giving us Jesus' peace. (v. 27)
  - What kind of peace in Jesus are we given through the Holy Spirit?
