We come before our Holy God recognizing that we are sinful and daily need His forgiveness.


P God is light and in Him is no darkness at all.

P The second reading is from Matthew 7:24-29.


C Sanctify us by Your truth, O LORD. Your Word is truth!


I believe in God, the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth.


The third day He rose again from the dead. He ascended into heaven and sits at the right hand of God the Father Almighty. From there He will come to judge the living and the dead.
