

For I say to you that God is able to raise up children to Abraham from these stones. ⁹ "And even now the ax is laid to the root of the trees. Therefore every tree which does not bear good fruit is cut down and thrown into the fire." ¹⁰ So the people asked him, saying, "What shall we do then?" 11 He answered and said to them, "He who has two tunics, let him give to him who has none; and he who has food, let him do likewise." 12 Then tax collectors also came to be baptized, and said to him, "Teacher, what shall we do?" 13 And he said to them, "Collect no more than what is appointed for you." ¹⁴ Likewise the soldiers asked him, saying, "And what shall we do?" So he said to them, "Do not intimidate anyone or accuse falsely, and be content with your wages." 15 Now as the people were in expectation, and all reasoned in their hearts about John, whether he was the Christ or not, 16 John answered, saying to all, "I indeed baptize you with water; but One mightier than I is coming, whose sandal strap I am not worthy to loose. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire. 17 "His winnowing fan is in His hand, and He will thoroughly clean out His threshing floor, and gather the wheat into His barn; but the chaff He will burn with unquenchable fire." ¹⁸ And with many other exhortations he preached to the people.





CHRIST IS CHRISTMAS

(Bible Passages compiled by Pastor Em. Daniel Fleischer)

What is Christmas as the world celebrates it without Christ? What is ____mas? Observance of Christmas without Christ is an excuse for a party. It is a charade. The true spirit and meaning of Christmas is understood and meaningful only if it translates to confidence of faith in the living Word, Christ Jesus "through sanctification by the Spirit and belief in the truth, to which He called you by [the] gospel, for the obtaining of the glory of our Lord Jesus Christ" (2 Thessalonians 2:13-14). "For this cause I was born, and for this cause I have come into the world, that I should bear witness to the truth. Everyone who is of the truth hears My voice." (John 18:37)

Christ was Prophesied

"I will put enmity between you and the woman, and between your seed and her Seed; He shall bruise your head, and you shall bruise His heel" (Genesis 3:15). [1 John 3:5-8]

"Behold, the days are coming," says the Lord, "That I will raise to David a Branch of righteousness; A King shall reign and prosper, and execute judgment and righteousness in the earth. In His days Judah will be saved, And Israel will dwell safely; Now this is His name by which He will be called: <u>THE LORD OUR RIGHTEOUSNESS</u>" (Jeremiah 23:5-6). [1 Corinthians 1:30-31]

"The Lord your God will raise up for you a Prophet like me from your midst, from your brethren. Him you shall hear..." (Deuteronomy 18:15). [Acts 3:22]

"There shall come forth a Rod from the stem of Jesse, <u>and a Branch shall grow out of his</u> <u>roots</u>" (Isaiah 11:1). [Matthew 1:1,6]

"Therefore the Lord Himself will give you a sign: Behold, the virgin shall conceive and

"For unto us a Child is born, unto us a Son is given; And the government will be upon His shoulder. And His name will be called Wonderful, Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, <u>Prince of Peace</u>. Of the increase of His government and peace There will be no end, upon the throne of David and over His kingdom, to order it and establish it with judgment and justice from that time forward, even forever. The zeal of the Lord of hosts will perform this" (Isaiah 9:6-7). [Ephesians 2:13-14]

Christ Came

"And you know that <u>He was manifested</u> to take away our sins, and in Him there is no sin... For this purpose the <u>Son of God was manifested</u>, that He might destroy the works of the devil. (1 John 3:5-8)

"But of Him you are in Christ Jesus, who became for us wisdom from God--<u>and</u> <u>righteousness and sanctification and redemption</u>-- that, as it is written, "He who glories, let him glory in the Lord." (1 Corinthians 1:30-31)

"For Moses truly said to the fathers, 'The <u>Lord your God will raise up for you a Prophet</u> like me from your brethren. Him you shall hear in all things, whatever He says to you." (Acts 3:22)

"The book of the <u>genealogy of Jesus Christ</u>, the Son of David, the Son of Abraham... Boaz begot Obed by Ruth, <u>Obed begot Jesse</u>, and <u>Jesse begot David the king</u>..." (Matthew 1:1-6).

"Now in the sixth month the angel Gabriel was sent by God to a city of Galilee named Nazareth, to a virgin betrothed to a man whose name was Joseph, of the house of David. The <u>virgin's</u> name was Mary. And having come in, the angel said to her, "Rejoice, highly favored one, the Lord is with you; blessed are you among women!" ... Then the angel said to her, "Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favor with God. And behold, you

will conceive in your womb and bring forth a Son, and shall call His name Jesus" (Luke 1:26-31).

"So it was, that while they were there [Bethlehem], the days were completed for her to be delivered. And she brought forth her firstborn Son, and wrapped Him in swaddling cloths, and laid Him in a manger, because there was no room for them in the inn" (Luke 2:6-7).

"For there is born to you this day in the city of David a Savior, who is Christ the Lord" (Luke 2:11).

"So it was, when the angels had gone away from them into heaven, that the shepherds said to one another, "Let us now go to Bethlehem and see this thing that has come to pass, which the Lord has made known to us." (Luke 2:15)

"But now in <u>Christ Jesus</u> you who once were far off have been brought near by the blood of Christ. For He Himself <u>is our peace</u>..." (Ephesians 2:13-14).

Christ is With Us

"In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God... And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we beheld His glory, the glory as of the only begotten of the Father, full of grace and truth" (John 1:1,14).

"Behold, the virgin shall be with child, and bear a Son, and they shall call His name Immanuel," which is translated, "God with us." Matthew 1:23

"All flesh is as grass, and all the glory of man as the flower of the grass. The grass withers, and its flower falls away, but the <u>word of the Lord endures forever"</u> (1 Peter 1: 24-25).

"'...And lo, I am with you always, even to the end of the age" (Matthew 28:20).

"And the Lord, He is the one who goes before you. <u>He will be with you</u>, He will not leave you nor forsake you; do not fear nor be dismayed" (Deuteronomy 31:8).

"Fear not, for I am with you; be not dismayed, for I am your God. I will strengthen you, yes, I will help you, I will uphold you with My righteous right hand'" (Isaiah 41:10).

"But now, thus says the Lord, who created you, O Jacob, And He who formed you, O Israel: 'Fear not, for I have redeemed you; I have called you by your name; You are Mine. When you pass through the waters, I will be with you; and through the rivers, they shall not overflow you. When you walk through the fire, you shall not be burned, nor shall the flame scorch you. For I am the Lord your God..." (Isaiah 41:1-3).

"What then shall we say to these things? If God is for us, who can be against us? He who did not spare His own Son, but delivered Him up for us all, how shall He not with Him also freely give us all things? Who shall bring a charge against God's elect? It is God who justifies. Who is he who condemns? It is Christ who died, and furthermore is also risen, who is even at the right hand of God, who also makes intercession for us. Who shall separate us from the love of Christ? Shall tribulation, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or peril, or sword" (Romans 8:31-35)?

"Yea, though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil; For <u>You are with me</u>; Your rod and Your staff, they comfort me" (Psalm 23:4).

Christ is Coming Again

"For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have everlasting life. For God did not send His Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world through Him might be saved" (John 3:16-17).

"Let not your heart be troubled; you believe in God, believe also in Me. In My Father's house are many mansions; if it were not so, I would have told you. I go to prepare a place for you. And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come again and receive you to Myself; that where I am, there you may be also" (John 14:1-2).

"For as the <u>Father</u> raises the dead and gives life to them, even so the Son gives life to whom He will. For the Father judges no one, but <u>has committed all judgment to the Son..."</u> (John 5:21-22).

"Beloved, do not forget this one thing, that with the Lord one day is as a thousand years, and a thousand years as one day. The Lord is not slack concerning His promise, as some count slackness, but is long suffering toward us, not willing that any should perish but that all should come to repentance. But the day of the Lord will come as a thief in the night, in which the heavens will pass away with a great noise, and the elements will melt with fervent heat; both the earth and the works that are in it will be burned up. Therefore, since all these things will be dissolved, what manner of persons ought you to be in holy conduct and godliness..." (2 Peter 3:8-11).

"When the Son of Man comes in His glory, and all the holy angels with Him, then He will sit on the throne of His glory. All the nations will be gathered before Him, and He will separate them one from another, as a shepherd divides his sheep from the goats. And He will set the sheep on His right hand, but the goats on the left. Then the King will say to those on His right hand, 'Come, you blessed of My Father, inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world...'" (Matthew 25:31-34).

Here then is the meaning and beauty of Christmas to all Who understand it: "And this is the testimony: that <u>God has given us eternal life</u>, and this life is in His Son. He who has the Son has life; he who does not have the Son of God does not have life. <u>These things I have written to you who believe in the name of the Son of God, that you may know that you have eternal life</u>, and that you may continue to believe in the name of the Son of God" (1 John 5:11-13).

General Fund – In the month of November we spent about \$12,000 more than we received in contributions. This increased the deficit in the fund to just over of \$111,000 compared to a year ago when it we had a deficit of about \$34,000. Contributions through November are down about \$53,000 from last year at this time.

ILC Operations – Revenue is up about \$38,000 over the same period as last year while disbursements are up about \$22,000.

ILC Building Projects – Year-to-date contributions have been about \$157,000 with the remaining revenue of around \$122,000 a result of increases in the market value of the investments

Church Extension Fund – Year to date revenue consists of payments received of almost \$114,000 from congregations on the loans they owe the CLC, about \$195,000 of increases in the market value of the investments and just under \$1,000 of contributions to the fund.

Other Auxiliary Funds – The activity in the other funds in the table above is similar to the activity in the same period a year ago.
